

BOARD OF PUBLIC WORKS & SAFETY

The Board of Public Works & Safety of the City of Huntingburg met in regular session on Thursday, January 8, 2015 at the hour of 8:30 A.M. in the Council Chambers of the Huntingburg City Hall with members Spinner, Souders and Cox present. Also present was City Attorney Schneider.

Mayor Spinner called the meeting to order.

A motion was made by Souders, seconded by Cox and carried to approve the minutes of the December 4, 2014 meeting.

A motion was made by Cox, seconded by Spinner and carried to approve the claims as presented.

A motion was made by Spinner, seconded by Cox and carried to appoint Paul Lake, Market Master, for the City of Huntingburg for the year 2015.

Police Chief Parks presented his monthly report. He asked the Board to approve a conditional offer of employment to Tyler S. Stivers to be a police officer. He noted that with the addition of Stivers the force would have 12 officers. Parks would like the approval now so that Stivers can attend the upcoming police academy in March.

A motion was made by Spinner, seconded by Cox and carried to approve offering Tyler S. Stivers a conditional offer of employment as a police officer.


Fire Chief Patberg presented his monthly report.

Wastewater Superintendent Kemp presented his monthly report. Kemp indicated that estimated cost for the phosphorus removal project is approximately \$25,000.00 down from the engineers' estimate of \$184,000.00 due to the City already having required building and infrastructure in place.


Street Superintendent Stamm presented his monthly report. He noted that weather permitting work will begin on the replacement of the 24 inch storm sewer line on 1st Street between Jackson Street and Van Buren Street. Paving of 1st Street will be done next year after the renovation of the Police Station is complete.

Code Enforcement Officer Collett presented his monthly report. Collett updated the Board on the status of the Order to Demolish the Birch house at 609 N. Washington Street, Huntingburg. It was noted the Judge gave Birch additional time to comply with specific deficiencies and allowed the City to inspect the property. It was noted that a City inspection will be done as soon as possible and then at the beginning of each month thereafter in accordance with the court order.

There being no further business to come before the Board, a motion to adjourn was made by Souders, seconded by Cox and carried at 8:52 A.M.
