UTILITY BOARD/COMMON COUNCIL Tuesday, January 14, 2020 5:30 P.M.

The Common Council and Utility Board of the City of Huntingburg met in joint session at the regularly scheduled meeting time on Tuesday, January 14, 2020 at the hour of 5:30 P.M. in the Council Chambers of the Huntingburg City Hall at 508 E. Fourth Street, Huntingburg, Indiana. Members Dubon, Bounds, Kissling, McPherron, and Wehr were present. Also present were Mayor Spinner, City Attorney Schneider and Clerk-Treasurer Dippel.

Mayor Spinner called the meeting to order.

The Mayor welcomed newly elected Council member Jose Dubon (District 4).

A motion was made by Kissling, seconded by Bounds and carried to approve the minutes of the December 23, 2019 meeting.

A motion was made by Wehr, seconded by Bounds and carried to approve the claims as presented.

Jenny Dearwester, of Southern Indiana Development Corporation, who is administering the City's Owner Occupied Repair program, was present to open bids for the Owner Occupied Repair program construction work. The bids were opened and read aloud. The bid tab is Exhibit A.

A motion was made by McPherron, seconded by Dubon and carried to take the bids under advisement and wait for a report from Dearwester with a recommendation for award.

Dearwester is scheduled to return with a recommendation in two weeks.

A motion was made by McPherron, seconded by Kissling and carried to elect Council Member Tim Wehr, Council President Pro-tem for the year 2020.

A motion was made by Kissling, seconded by Bounds and carried to designate The Herald as the City's official newspaper.

The Mayor presented a list of appointees to various Boards and Commissions (Exhibit B). List includes Mayoral, Common Council and County Commissioner appointees. The Mayor recommended Common Council appointments of:

Board of Zoning Appeals-Mike Fulkerson Housing Authority-Jose Dubon Planning Commission- Glen Kissling, Josh Morrison and Rachel Steckler Redevelopment Commission- Robert Bayer and Jayme Rasche Tree Committee- Marie Seibert

A motion was made by Wehr, seconded by McPherron and carried to accept the Mayors recommendations for Common Council appointees as presented.

The annual fire protection ordinance authorizing the Board of Public Works and Safety to enter into a fire protection agreement with the Patoka Township Trustee was presented for approval. The contract is in the amount of \$26,000.00.

A motion was made by Kissling, seconded by Bounds and carried to introduce Ordinance No. 2020-01 entitled:

AN ORDINANCE AUTHORIZING THE BOARD OF PUBLIC WORKS AND SAFETY TO ENTER INTO A FIRE PROTECTION CONTRACT WITH THE PATOKA TOWNSHIP TRUSTEE A motion was made by Wehr, seconded by Kissling and carried with unanimous consent to suspend the rules and consider the adoption of Ordinance No. 2020-01 at the same meeting it was introduced.

A motion was made by McPherron, seconded by Bounds and carried to adopt Ordinance No. 2020-01.

Upon call of roll for the adoption or rejection of Ordinance No. 2020-01 the vote being 5 ayes, 0 nays, in favor of adoption, Ordinance No. 2020-01 was duly passed and adopted this date at the hour of 5:54 P.M.

The annual ordinance authorizing entering into a recreational services contract with the Patoka Township Trustee was presented for approval. The contract is in the amount of \$12,000.00.

A motion was made by McPherron, seconded by Wehr and carried to introduce Ordinance No. 2020-02 entitled:

AN ORDINANCE AUTHORIZING THE COMMON COUNCIL TO ENTER INTO A RECREATIONAL SERVICES CONTRACT WITH THE PATOKA TOWNSHIP TRUSTEE

A motion was made by Kissling, seconded by Dubon and carried with unanimous consent to suspend the rules and consider the adoption of Ordinance No. 2020-02 at the same meeting it was introduced.

A motion was made by Kissling, seconded by McPherron and carried to adopt Ordinance No. 2020-02.

Upon call of roll for the adoption or rejection of Ordinance No. 2020-02 the vote being 5 ayes, 0 nays, in favor of adoption, Ordinance No. 2020-02 was duly passed and adopted this date at the hour of 5:56 P.M.

The Mayor informed the Board that contract for the water plant and line upgrades were awarded conditionally pending review and funding by SRF. He noted the review and funding has been approved.

Water Superintendent Meyerholtz noted that the Board now needs to give final approval to award each contract.

A motion was made by Kissling, seconded by Bounds and carried to approve the contract between the City of Huntingburg and Huntingburg Machine Works for Division I, water main replacement in the amount of \$1,394,552.00

A motion was made by McPherron, seconded by Wehr and carried to approve the contract between the City of Huntingburg and Reynolds Construction for Division II, water treatment plant improvements in the amount of \$4,880,700.00.

A motion was made by Wehr, seconded by Dubon and carried to approve the contract between the City of Huntingburg and Solential Energy for Division III, water treatment plant improvements and solar field addition in the amount of \$468,031.00.

Meyerholtz requested permission to purchase 500 Sensus water meters under the locked in price for the contract which expires 12/31/2020. He noted the cost of the 500 meters would be \$118,000.00. He is also looking to purchase 500 meters in December 2020.

A motion was made by Kissling, seconded by Bounds and carried to approve the expenditure of \$118,000.00 for meters for the purchase in January.

Attorney Schneider informed the Council of the proposal being kicked around concerning Dubois County Baseball (Dubois County Bombers). He noted that currently the Bombers are piggy backing their alcohol beverage sales off of another vendor that has a catering license and it has become somewhat awkward at times. He noted the Indiana

Alcohol beverage laws do allow the City to hold an alcohol beverage permit for the stadium and the City can contract with a concessionaire such as Dubois County Baseball to manage that permit. The proposal is that the City apply for the beer and wine alcohol beverage permit for League Stadium and eventually contract with Dubois County Baseball to manage the permit. Schneider noted if the Council wants to pursue the permit he can prepare a resolution for consideration at the next meeting. Schneider noted the City would not have liability under the agreement, and the manager would have to carry the insurance and be in charge of managing the permit. The Mayor noted the same type of arrangement is being looked at for Market Street Park as well. Schneider noted the permit is an annual permit so the City would have to reapply annually, and would recommend the management contract be annual so it can be reviewed annually. He noted the cost of a 2-way license is \$750.00.

A motion was made by Kissling, seconded by Dubon and carried that Schneider proceed with the drafting of the resolution as noted above.

There being no further business before the Council, a motion was made by Kissling, seconded by Dubon and carried to adjourn the meeting at 6:11 o'clock P.M.
