

UTILITY BOARD/COMMON COUNCIL

Tuesday, November 12, 2019

5:30 P.M.

The Common Council and Utility Board of the City of Huntingburg met in joint session at the regularly scheduled meeting time on Tuesday, November 12, 2019 at the hour of 5:30 P.M. in the Council Chambers of the Huntingburg City Hall at 508 E. Fourth Street, Huntingburg, Indiana. Members Blessinger, McPherron, Wehr, Kissling and Bounds were present. Also present were Mayor Spinner, City Attorney Schneider and Clerk-Treasurer Dippel. Members of the Utility Rate Advisory Board present were Young, Bowman, Flick and Thewes; absent was Dearing.

Mayor Spinner called the meeting to order.

A motion was made by Wehr, seconded by Blessinger and carried to approve the minutes of the October 22, 2019 meeting.

A motion was made by Kissling, seconded by Bounds and carried to approve the claims as presented.

The Mayor introduced John Wetzel, of Midwestern Engineers, to present the bids received for the 3 Divisions of the Water System Improvements (Exhibit A). He noted the three Divisions are:

Div. I – Water main replacement along US 231/Main Street

Div. II – Water treatment plant improvements

Div. III – Water treatment plant improvements-Solar field addition

The Mayor also noted the Divisions II and III had alternate bids that include rock and fabric underneath the solar field.

Wetzel noted that originally the total project estimate was \$7,015,000.00, now the estimate is \$8,000,000.00.

Wetzel recommended the following bids for the projects:

Div. I – Huntingburg Machine Works for the Base Bid in the amount of \$1,394,552.00.

Div. II – Reynolds Construction LLC for the Base Bid plus Mandatory Alt. A bid in the amount of \$4,880,700.00.

Div. III – Solential Energy for the base bid in the amount of \$468,031.00.

A motion was made by Blessinger, seconded by Kissling and carried to accept the bid from Huntingburg Machine Works for water main replacement contingent upon funding and SRF's approval in the amount of \$1,394,552.00.

A motion was made by Kissling, seconded by McPherron and carried to award the contract (water treatment plant improvements) based on the contingency of receiving funding and SRF approval to Reynolds Construction in the amount of \$4,880,700.00.

A motion was made by Kissling, seconded by McPherron and carried to amend the motion to approve the water treatment plant improvements to include Alternate A (which was already included in the total dollar figure).

A motion was made by Bounds, seconded by Wehr and carried to accept the bid from Solential Energy for the solar field in the amount of \$468,031.00 (base bid only).

Wetzel is to prepare documentation for SRF review and approval.

The Mayor called into session the Utility Rate Advisory Board to review and advise the Common Council as to the proposed water rate increase. He introduced Otto (Buzz) Krohn, of O.W. Krohn and Associates, to go over a special report for the financing and proposed new water rates needed for the SRF bonding financing of the water treatment plant improvements. Krohn led a discussion of the report and proposed

rates, and noted the total project cost to finance is \$8,000,000.00 at a rate of 2.59% with bonds financed by SRF. Krohn noted that a loan from the Electric Utility will be used to pay back the 2014 bond issue.

A motion was made by Young, seconded by Bowman and carried to adopt (URAB) Resolution No. 2019-03 entitled:

RESOLUTION OF THE HUNTINGBURG UTILITY RATE ADVISORY BOARD REGARDING MUNICIPAL WATERWORKS RATES

With the above resolution the Utility Rate Advisory Board recommended the new water rates and charges.

A motion was made by Blessinger, seconded by Wehr and carried to adopt Resolution No. 2019-42 entitled:

RESOLUTION OF THE HUNTINGBURG UTILITY BOARD REGARDING MUNICIPAL WATERWORKS RATES

Attorney Schneider presented a proposed ordinance authorizing the issuance of up to \$8,000,000.00 of SRF bonds to finance the waterworks improvements.

A motion was made by McPherron, seconded by Bounds and carried to introduce Ordinance No. 2019-43 entitled:

An Ordinance of the City of Huntingburg authorizing the issuance of waterworks revenue bonds for the purpose of providing funds to pay the cost of construction of certain additions, extensions and improvements to the municipal waterworks of said City, providing for the safeguarding of the interests of the owners of said bonds, other matters connected therewith, including the issuance of notes in anticipation of bonds, and repealing ordinances inconsistent herewith

A motion was made by Bounds, seconded by Wehr and carried to introduce Ordinance No. 2019-44 entitled:

AN ORDINANCE ESTABLISHING A NEW SCHEDULE OF RATES AND CHARGES FOR THE USE AND SERVICES RENDERED BY THE MUNICIPAL WATERWORKS OF THE CITY OF HUNTINGBURG, INDIANA AND MATTERS CONNECTED THEREWITH

A motion was made by Flick, seconded by Thewes and carried to adjourn the Utility Rate Advisory Board meeting at 6:22 P.M.

The Mayor noted that Ordinance 2019-41 was previously introduced dealing with issuance of taxable economic development revenue bonds for the OFS project.

A motion was made by Blessinger, seconded by McPherron and carried to adopt Ordinance No. 2019-41 entitled:

AN ORDINANCE AUTHORIZING THE CITY OF HUNTINGBURG, INDIANA TO ISSUE ITS "TAXABLE ECONOMIC DEVELOPMENT REVENUE BONDS OF 2019, (OFS PROJECT)" AND APPROVING AND AUTHORIZING OTHER ACTIONS IN RESPECT THERE TO

Upon call of roll for the adoption or rejection of Ordinance No. 2019-41 the vote being 5 ayes, 0 nays, in favor of adoption, Ordinance No. 2019-41 was duly passed and adopted this date at the hour of 6:23 P.M.

The Mayor noted that the 2020 salary ordinance was discussed at the last meeting. He noted generally the high range was increased by 2.5% with the exception of the police that increased 5% to stay in line with other local law enforcement agencies.

A motion was made by Wehr, seconded by Kissling and carried to introduce Ordinance No. 2019-45 entitled:

AN ORDINANCE FIXING SALARIES FOR THE CITY OF HUNTINGBURG, INDIANA FOR THE YEAR 2020

A motion was made by Kissling, seconded by McPherron and carried with unanimous consent to suspend the rules and consider the adoption of Ordinance No. 2019-45 at the same meeting it was introduced.

A motion was made by Kissling, seconded by McPherron and carried to adopt Ordinance No. 2019-45.

Upon call of roll for the adoption or rejection of Ordinance No. 2019-45 the vote being 5 ayes, 0 nays, in favor of adoption, Ordinance No. 2019-45 was duly passed and adopted this date at the hour of 6:25 P.M.

The Mayor presented a proposed ordinance regulating traffic on portions of 4th Street in the City of Huntingburg. Vehicle size, weight restrictions, parking and special permitting were discussed. This would amend Section 71 of the City's Code of Ordinances. It was noted that this action was recommended by the Huntingburg Board of Public Works and Safety.

A motion was made by McPherron, seconded by Wehr and carried to introduce Ordinance No. 2019-46 entitled:

AN ORDINANCE AMENDING THE HUNTINGBURG CODE OF ORDINANCES CHAPTER 71 TO ADD A SUBCHAPTER REGULATING TRAFFIC ON PORTIONS OF FOURTH STREET IN THE CITY OF HUNTINGBURG

The Mayor presented a proposed ordinance amending truck routes in the City. It was noted that this action was recommended by the Huntingburg Board of Public Works and Safety. The ordinance would amend the following weight restriction exceptions:

Amend:	Street	Location
	4th Street	Between Walnut and Van Buren Streets, except as Specified in Chapter 71.41 and Chapter 71.42
Delete:	Geiger Street	Between 3rd Street and 4th Street
Amend:	Walnut Street	Between 3rd Street and 4th Street

A motion was made by Blessinger, seconded by McPherron and carried to introduce Ordinance No. 2019-47 entitled:

AN ORDINANCE AMENDING THE HUNTINGBURG CODE OF ORDINANCES CHAPTER 74, SCHEDULE IX PROVIDING FOR WEIGHT RESTRICTIONS EXCEPTIONS ON DESIGNATED STREETS WITHIN THE CITY OF HUNTINGBURG

The Mayor presented a proposed ordinance amending no parking on portions of certain designated streets in the City. It was noted that this action was recommended by the Huntingburg Board of Public Works and Safety. The ordinance would amend no parking in the City as following:

A motion was made by McPherron, seconded by Wehr and carried to introduce Ordinance No. 2019-48 entitled:

AN ORDINANCE AMENDING THE HUNTINGBURG CODE OF ORDINANCES CHAPTER 75 PROVIDING FOR NO PARKING ON PORTIONS OF CERTAIN DESIGNATED STREETS WITHIN THE CITY OF HUNTINGBURG

The purchase of a Multihog MX120 tractor with snow plow accessories was approved by the Board of Public Works and Safety at their last meeting for the purchase price of \$198,346.00 from Brown Equipment. The Council is to consider the financing of the tractor through US Bancorp arranged through the Indiana Bond Bank. The financing will be a 4 year lease/purchase at a rate of 2.222%. (signed and initialed lease will be Exhibit B when executed)

A motion was made by McPherron, seconded by Bounds and carried to adopt Resolution No. 2019-49 entitled:

A RESOLUTION OF THE COMMON COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF HUNTINGBURG AUTHORIZING THE LEASE FINANCING OF EQUIPMENT THROUGH THE INDIANA BOND BANK

The Mayor presented a request for engineering services and grant application submittal request for proposal through the Department of Health in Indiana to provide funding for a planning grant for a countywide bicycle and pedestrian master plan (Exhibit C). The City of Huntingburg, Dubois County, and the City of Jasper are soliciting the plan which will include connectivity with all four County High Schools, the County Park, along with connectivity of the existing County and City trail systems. He noted the amount of the Grant would be \$20,000.00 which would be matched by local funds. There has been discussion with Dubois Strong and Dubois County Community Foundation of sharing the local match. He noted that he is looking for approval to enter into an agreement with the City of Jasper and Dubois County to create a request for proposal for a potential grant for a multipurpose comprehensive bike trail through Dubois County.

A motion was made by Blessinger, seconded by Kissling and carried to approve entering into an agreement with the City of Jasper and Dubois County to create a request for proposal for a potential grant for a multipurpose comprehensive bike trail through Dubois County.

Energy Superintendent Reutepohler presented quotes for 4 transformers for the 4 buildings in the Wagonworks project. He indicated the low quote was from Anixter in the amount of \$17,352.00. It was Reutepohler’s recommendation to purchase the transformers from Anixter.

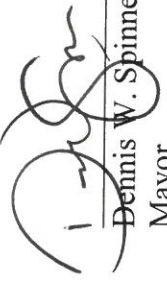
A motion was made by Wehr, seconded by McPherron and carried to approve the quote from Anixter for 4 transformers for the Wagonworks project in the amount of \$17,352.00.

Reutepohler presented 2 quotes for gang switches to be used in the airport upgrade. The low quote was from Anixter in the amount of \$13,848.00. The other quote was from Brownstown Electric Supply in the amount of \$14,240.00. Reutepohler recommended purchasing the switches from Brownstown Electric Supply because of better quality, have ice shields and better quality arc suppressors.

A motion was made by Kissling, seconded by Blessinger and carried to approve the purchase of gang switches from Brownstown Electric Supply in the amount of \$14,240.00.

Clerk-Treasurer Dippel distributed copies for the Council to sign of the required annual certification for compliance with the City's municipal nepotism policy and compliance with municipal contracting with a unit policy.

There being no further business before the Council, a motion was made by Kissling, seconded by Bounds and carried to adjourn the meeting at 6:45 o'clock P.M.

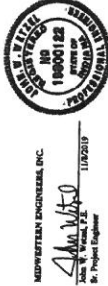

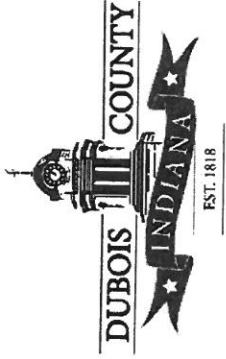
