

UTILITY BOARD/COMMON COUNCIL
Tuesday, October 11, 2022
5:30 P.M.

The Common Council and Utility Board of the City of Huntingburg met in joint session on Tuesday, October 11, 2022 at the hour of 5:30 P.M. in the Council Chambers of the Huntingburg City Hall at 508 E. Fourth Street, Huntingburg, Indiana. Members Bounds, Dubon, Kissling, McPherron and Wehr were physically present. This meeting was opened to the public, and made available to members of the public and the media streamed through the City of Huntingburg's YouTube channel accessed via the City of Huntingburg's website. Also present were Mayor Schwinghamer, City Attorney Schneider, and Deputy Clerk-Treasurer Stevens.

Mayor Schwinghamer called the meeting to order.

A motion was made by Kissling, seconded by McPherron and carried to approve the minutes of the September 27, 2022 regular meeting.

A motion was made by Wehr, seconded by Bounds and carried to approve the claims as presented.

Angela McDonald and Paula Book with the National Society Daughters of the American Revolution were present and gave a background on the Society. They invited the Council to their upcoming Centennial Open House to be held at the Huntingburg Old Town Hall on October 17th from 2:00 P.M. to 4:00 P.M.

The Mayor read and presented his proclamation, proclaiming October 17, 2022 as The Centennial of the Dubois County Chapter, National Society Daughters of the American Revolution, to McDonald and Book. (Exhibit A)

The Mayor noted that Halloween hours for Trick-or-Treat needs to be approved. The proposed hours are October 31, 2022 from 5:30 P.M. to 8:00 P.M.

A motion was made by McPherron, seconded by Kissling and carried to approve the hours from 5:30 P.M. to 8:00 P.M. on October 31st for Trick-or-Treat.

Mayor Schwinghamer presented a proposed resolution to amend Resolution No. 2012-06 raising the small purchase limit of \$5,000.00 to \$10,000.00.

A motion was made by Bounds, seconded by Kissling and carried to adopt Resolution No. 2022-36 entitled:


A RESOLUTION AMENDING RESOLUTION NO. 2012-06

ITS VARIOUS DEPARTMENTS


